Elder (Apostle) Harry L. Jackson was born in Rochester, NY, on July 2, 1962, and served in the United States Army from 1981-1989. After leaving the Army, he live in Germany for 11 years, and accepted Jesus Christ in November 1991. He served first as an Usher, and then in Audio Ministry, Sound Reinforcement, Evangelism, his local, district and Jurisdictional Music Departments, as a psalmist, worship leader, and musician, provided computer support, and helped to establish a ministry in a refugee camp in Germany. On March 5, 1995, he answered the call of God to preach the Gospel, and received his Ministerial License in October 1999. He was ordained as an Elder in February 2005, and as a Pastor in June of 2007. Apostle Jackson holds Associate degrees in Christian Ministry, Business Administration and Computer Programming , is currently studying for a fourth degree in Web Design, and will continue studying for his Bachelor's in 2011. Bro. Jackson serves as Professor of Homiletics at United Christian Ministry Institute Rochester, New York Campus, and was awarded an Honorary Doctorate in Christian Ministry in 2010. He founded Christ Foundation Church and Ministries, Inc. in 2007, and is currently transitioning into the Apostolic office under the oversight of Apostle Bernetha Mouzon of Global Impact Ministries International.

Throughout his life, Apostle Jackson has faced, survived and overcome issues such as drug and alcohol abuse, pornography, and rejection. Because he has a heart for helping men who deal with the same struggles, he is currently formulating the vision for Harry Jackson Ministries, which will be an outreach arm of CFCM designed to address such issues.

1. WATCHMEN

What they do:

Stand watch over the people; exhort, encourage, warn, instruct.
Care for needs of the people; feed; stand guard over leaders.
Protect, defend, intercede.

2. GATEKEEPERS

What they do:

Guard the entry and exit points of the Kingdom; watch the outer perimeter of the city, the Kingdom, region, church, etc. Alert the watchmen of imminent threats, dangers approaching and/or entering in.

3. BREAKERS:

What they do:

Tear down strongholds; Break through walls and barriers so that God's people may pass through. Set atmospheres (i.e. Worship, preparation for the preached Word); break up and soften "hard" areas of the Body. Open the hearts of the people; Call down the glory of God; invoke the spirit of worship, healing, etc.

Micah 2:13; Is. 54:3; Is. 61:1

New Testament Equivalents:

Prophets, Teachers, Evangelists, Prophetic Worshippers (Worship Leaders, Psalmists, Minstrels and Musicians, Dancers), Intercessors, Armorbearers, Helps Ministries



4. REPAIRERS OF THE BREACH

What they do:

Fix ‘holes’ in the walls of the Kingdom; Establish defensive perimeters; Act as peacemakers; Repair broken relationships; Restorers; Rebuild that which has been broken down; Minister spiritual healing to individuals, relationships, ministries, regions.
